SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION

Eligibility

All of the following requirements must be met:

Undergraduate and graduate students must be enrolled in or accepted into a full time accredited college or university program

Undergraduate students must have a minimum overall grade point average of 3.0. Graduate students must have a minimum overall grade point average of 3.2.

Applicants must be enrolled in a major, or in a graduate group, emphasizing pest management in an area pertaining to plant pathology, entomology, nematology, acarology, and weed science.

The student's financial needs and income will be considered. Sufficient evidence should be furnished to the Scholarship Committee to enable valid evaluation. Failure to give an honest or complete financial statement will automatically remove the student from consideration.

Awards

Formal recognition of the scholarship recipients is made at the Association of Applied Insect Ecologists Annual Meeting held each February.

Students must present verification of registration for the upcoming quarter or semester to the Foundation prior to receipt of any funds. Enrollment must be in the major or accepted area in the college or university stated in their application. Eligible graduate students will be considered for up to a \$1,500 scholarship. Eligible undergraduate students will be considered for up to a \$750 scholarship.

How to Apply (Applications must be postmarked on or before November 25)

The application, transcripts and letters of recommendation must be mailed together as a packet. Incomplete application will not be reviewed. Applications will be considered complete if postmarked by November 25 or before with receipt of all the following items:

Completed student questionnaire.

A written statement of intent as it relates to a future career in applied ecology and Integrated Pest Management. Identify your interests in industry or research. Elaborate on how you became interested in and what efforts you have made to become familiar with the industry and/or research. *Please limit this statement to one page.*

Transcripts (may be copy) of college or university courses you have completed to date in your current degreed program.

A list of planned courses for the current academic year.

Two letters of recommendation. At least one letter should be from an academic advisor and/or recent instructor (within the last year). Letters of recommendation must be submitted with the application by the student, not sent separately.
